## PREFACE

This guide to the records of people and families named Fenner during the past six or seven centuries is designed to be both of general interest and valuable as a reference book for those who might wish to carry out research into Fenner genealogy. There cannot, of course, be space for all the records here - though it is nevertheless thought that among the three thousand or so people mentioned here are at least a few of the ancestors of everyone named Fenner living at the present time who are of English descent. The arrangement is basically in sections covering the more important sources - including the roll records preserved in the Public Record Office; wills; directories; and records of births, marriages and deaths, post-1837, at the General Register Office, London. Some additional material in the form of a list of miscellaneous marriages, specially compiled for this publication by Mr. D. Burling of the Society of Genealogists, appears as an appendix.

It may be noted that place names are generally given in their original form - except for cases where the spelling has been modernised in order to avoid unnecessary confusion. Also, the dates are given in the New Style, or Gregorian, calendar which came into general use in England and America in 1752.

## INTRODUCTION

The present-day name Fenner is an occupational one, deriving from the Mediaeval word 'veneur', meaning huntsman (cf. the Latin word for hunt: venari). In early English records it is usually found in the Norman-French form - e.g. Walter le Veneur of Cambridgeshire recorded in the Pipe Rolls for 1195. Other early examples include David and Wm le Venur (Yorks Assize Rolls 1219), Rob le Venur of Lincs, Wm le Venator of Yorks and Geoffrey le Venour of Salop (Hundred Rolls 1273); Rob le Veneur of Lincs (Placita de Quo Warranto c1292). In the Kent Feet of Fines we find cases involving Hy de (sic) Venur and his wife Margt, plaintiffs v Ingelram de Prehaus, regarding 6 acres in Saltwood (1236); and Alice, late the wife of Peter le Venur, plaintiff v Tob & Wm de Port and Gilbert, son of Arnald, in connection with a  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 19 acres in Allington, Hollingbourne parish, formerly held by her husband, which she claimed as her dower (1227); and in the Sussex Feet of Fines a case, Rob de Bromfield & his wife Joan v Rob le Vennur, concerning property in Farenthe and Sonnyngleghe (1309).

In general the letter F replaced the V in Venour/Venner during the 16th and 17th centuries. However, such variations are also found here and there back as far as the 13th century. These include Rob le Fenur, a juror on a court case regarding a robbery at Canterbury in 1251 (Archaeologia Cantiana vol I); Wm le Fenere of Langford, Beds, who in 1297 was taxed 5s for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  qrs of wheat; 7s 6d for 3 qrs of drage (mixed oats & barley); 2s for a horse; 5s for a cow; and 2s 6d for a heifer; Rob le Fannere of Bardeneye, Lincs Diocese, 1304 (Patent Rolls) - probably related to Geoffrey le Venur recorded there the same year (ibid); Rado le Fanner of Pulborough 1327 (Sussex Lay Subsidy); Wm Faner of the Hundred of Axton 1334-35 (Kent Lay Subsidy); Ralph Fanner, plaintiff in a case regarding land in the parish of Gt Waltham 1459 (Essex Feet of Fines); and the following, listed in the Suffolk Subsidy of 1327:

A few Fenner families have also claimed to be descended from ancestors named atte Fenn - meaning a dweller at or near a fen or marsh. Fenn Place in Worth parish, Sussex, for instance, is said to have been owned by an atte Fenn family who changed their name to Fenner during the reign of Henry VI (see the pedigree under Sussex Records for further details).

In 1489-90 there was a grant by Jn Squyer, sen & jun, of Charlewood to Jn Fenner & Jn Wheler of Legh of a field, etc, in Charlewood near Horley, Surrey (Harl. Charter, British Museum). This Jn Fenner was presumably the Jn whose wife, Joan Fenner, has a memorial brass dated 1516 in the parish church of Horley. The same church also has a civilian brass effigy of c1520 which is supposed to represent Jn Fenner. The Horley Fenners are listed in some of the Surrey Subsidy Rolls for the Hundred of Reigate:

The Surrey Hearth Tax returns for 1664 list one Fenner - Wm of Lambeth. Although the name was chiefly centred on the south-east part of England there were also some families recorded in the Somerset/Devon area in the early 17th century, as shown by those Fenner marriages:

Fenner families were also established in Buckinghamshire from an early period. The Bucks musters for 1522 refer to Thos Fenner sen & jun, and Ric Fenner in the parish of Stone - while three Fenner marriages were recorded there in the mid 17th century - Anne & Thos Dorrell 1645; Joyce & Ric Olife 1646; and Jane & Hugh Spencer 1647. Other Fenners in the county were Hy of Weston Turville, plaintiff in a court case v Thos Pauly in 1688 (Ct of Arches); Sarah who married Wm Hunt at Amersham in 1709; Thos of Aylesbury who married Ann Neighbour of Saunderton by licence in 1736 (Bradenham); and Wm, mentioned as a farmer of Horsenden in 1791.

Extensive material on Fenners in East Anglia and adjoining areas are given in subsequent pages. Here we may just mention Rob Farmer (sic) of Syleham whose will (1560-64) is preserved at Bury St Edm; Jn Fenner who witnessed the will of Jn Mingay, linen-weaver of Bungay, in 1659; Jn buried at Monks Eleigh in 1574; Jn of Tattlingstone 1639-40 (Ship Money returns); Peter (a bac aged 22; native of Norwich) examined in 1637 when going to Holland to work at his trade for 2 months; and Wm, died 13 Feb 1827 aged 67, whose memorial inscription is in the churchyard of Kimbolton, Hunts. Of the many people named Fenner recorded in Cambridge (see Miscellaneous Marriages &c) the most celebrated was Francis Phillip Fenner, born there on 1st March 1811. He became a famous cricketer, "a very steady and scientific batsman, generally going in early, and has made some capital scores with the club of his native town" and a "fine fast round arm bowler". Under the patronage of Lord Stamford and Lord Burgaley he opened a cricket ground at Cambridge in 1846 - the present Cambridge University cricket ground, still called "Fenners". At one time he lived at 6 Market Hill as a grocer, tea dealer & tobacconist but was later landlord of the Royal Hotel, Cheltenham 1863-70; White Lion, Bath 1870-94; and died at 34 Pulteney Str, Bath, on 22nd May 1896.



CHANCERY PROCEEDINGS

- 1599 Thos Dingley, builder of Ewell, Surrey, stated that 10 years earlier he had agreed with Nich Fenner, yeo of the same, to acquire a copyhold tenement there and had lent him £20 towards the repair of a barn - but the said Nich had not kept the agreement.
- 1604 Gregory Fenner of London, esq, & his wife Bridget v Jn Foy, tailor of London, in respect of an exorbitant charge made for a dress made for Bridget before she was married.
- 1624 Geo Baker, guardian of Hy Fenner, infant son of Hy Fenner, deceased, tanner of E.Peckham, Kent, & his wife Dorothy v Jn Barton who with Ric Fenner, half brother of the complainant, defrauded the will of Hy sen.
- 1624 Sir Jn Fenner of Lordington, Sussex - plaintiff re. lands in Havant.
- 1629 My, wid & executrix of Allan Fenner, gent late of Westminster v Jn Millet of Perivale, Middlesex, who refused her possession of lands in Yealing (Ealing?), Middlesex, left to her in Allan's will.
- 1631-32 Jn Fenner or E.Grinstead, Sussex v the Bishop of Chichester; the complainant "being ignorant of the degrees of consanguinity, applied for a licence to marry Anne, dau of Ric Glover, deceased, and signed a bond for £100, 5th March 7 Charles I. The marriage was lawfully solemnized but he was compelled to do penance, standing in a white sheet in the churches of E.Grinstead and Maresfield, during the hours of Divine Service. Now the Bishop has not only divorced him from his wife but had him arrested on his bond"
- 1638 Edw, yeo of Egerton, executor of the will of his father, Edw Fenner v Edw Dering, gent of Boughton & Wm Bullock, husband of Anne, sister of Edw Fenner, re. £100 paid by Dering, who was given much hospitality at his house by Edw sen, towards the marriage of Anne.
- 1641 Geo Fenner esq of Maidstone & his wife Anne (widow & executrix of Edm Ellis of Otham) v Thos Mabbe, gent of Bearsted, Kent, re. fraudulent use of property in Langley, Otham, Bearsted & Thornham left to Anne by her late husband.
- 1649 Margt, wid of Jn Fenner, & administrator of his goods v Jn Van Dwist & partners re. shares in the ship Silver Falcon trading in tobacco.
- 1649 Jn Fenner of E.Grinstead, executor of Anne Fenner (b.1608), dau of Ric Glover, pewterer late of London, & My Glover -



re. legacy left to Anne.

post 1695 Wm Fenner of St Martins in the Fields, London (by his tutor, Leonard Thomson of Stony Stratford, Bucks) v Jn Graves of Christchurch, Southwark, re. lease of 1695 between inter alia Hy Fenner dec, Wm Fenner the elder, dec, & Wm Fenner the younger - "Wm Fenner the elder ran through his estate in Weston Durvils and Wendover, and went, some years since in the train of Artillery, as a gunner, into Portugal."

MARQUESS OF SALISBURY M.S.S.

1575 ref to ship of war owned by Geo Fennars of Sussex, manned by 45 Englishmen, which captured two French boats which they harboured in the West country and "somewhat made lighter there."

1599 letter from Lord Admiral the Lord Chancellor and Sir Rob Cecil to Mr Geo Fenner suggesting a naval stratagem to trick the Dutch.

1599-1600 "Capt Fenner employed as Admiral on the coast of Spain."

1602 Anthony Wilkinson to Sir Rob Cecil: "If Wilkinson and his wife be examind they will open the truth about Elston and his wife. Elstons wife hath dealt cunningly from the first by the advise of her uncle Fenner and others. I understand the Lord Admiral doth credit Capt Fenner who excuses Elston and with reason lest he open his budget and make him and others known."

1603 Major G. Fenner signs as one of the commissioners for restraint of passage.

1289 partition of lands that belonged to Margery le Venur, late wife of Jn de Annesty (in Leics); ref to her daus & co-heiresses Agnes & Amice.

- 1297 Wm le Venur, King's huntsman, sent to take 100 does in Odiham Park.

- 1320 Ric Fynnor of Everesdon acknowledged he owes £40 to Philip de Ewyas, to be levied in default of payment of his lands & chattels in Cambridgeshire.
- 1325 Nich le Venour, who had long served the King in the office of huntsman, maimed in the King's last hunt in the New Forest.
- 1329 order for new verderer for the Forest of Rutland to be elected in place of Peter le Venour dec.
- 1329 Jn le Venour of Middlesex acknowledged he owes, with Wm de Forneaux, £40 to Jn de Cherleton, to be levied in default of payment on their lands & chattels in the City of London.
- 1330 the escheator ordered to return a toft, 8 acres of land & one acre of meadow in Gt Curborough nr Lichfield, taken on the pretence that Wm, son & heir of Walter le Venour, is an idiot - as according to inquest Wm (now aged over 60) is not and was not an idiot from birth.
- 1333 Jn le Venour sent to the Prior of Southwark for maintenance on account of his good service to King Edward III and Queen Phillipa.
- 1334 ref to Jn le Venour, keeper of Kempton Pk (mentioned several further times up to 1339).
- 1336 Jn le Venour of Edmonton, Middlesex, imprisoned in Newgate gaol for the death of Jn, husband of Cicely Preston.

- 1340 Jn le Venour a witness of a document at Stoke Molyms (Herts?)
- 1340 Walter le Venour and other malefactors attacked Thos de Marleberge at Braynton nr Southfederton, Somerset.

### SUSSEX RECORDS

The Sussex Feet of Fines for 1506-7 include a case, Thos Fenner versus Wm Changeton & his wife Maud, concerning property at Ifield while the Sussex Subsidy for 1524-25 contains two Fenners - Jn of the Hundred of Danehill Horsted and Ric of the town of Crawley. The above Thos was presumably the Thos Fenner of Crawley whose P.C.C. will was proved in 1513. It mentioned his sons Ric, Thos dec, & Jn (father of Joan, Alice, Elizb, Jn sen aged 6 & Jn jun aged 4; husband of Anne). In 1511 Jn Fenner, gent of Cradeley was released rights & interests in land there previously held by Sur Hy Wyatt and others (British Museum addnl. charter). In 1560 a Jm Fenner esq was listed in the Subsidy Rolls (in the Tithing of Waunting, Rape of Bramber) and in 1571 Edw Fenner was named as one of those instructed to take an inquisition in the county. The mid 16th century Chichester Chapter Acts also contain a few Fenner references:

1559 confirmation off 41 year lease to Geo, gent.

1563 confirmation of leases to Edw Fenner the elder of the Middle Temple, gent, for 21 years (Amberley Castle) and to Wm of Ifield for 21 years.

1564 Geo Fenner gent witnessed copy of a lease made at Aldingbourne.

1566 confirmation of lease off Bracklesham prebend, lordship & parsonage to Geo, gent of Erneley, for 41 years.

Sussex Quarter Sessions records refer to an Andrew Fenner at Lewes in 1642 (as a juror ?) and two husbandmen of Ifield, Wm & Arthur Fenner, being bound over for trespass and illegal fishing in 1646. A pedigree covering several of the above mentioned Fenners in Sussex is preserved in the library of the Society of Genealogists in London. It is based to some extent on the one published by the Harlaeian Society (vol. 53, p. 107) and contains several omissions and a few anomalies. However we give it here in full:

Fenner was a staunch puritan and wrote numerous religious publications setting forth the puritan point of view. On Whitgift becoming Archbishop of Canterbury a harsher attitude towards the puritans was adopted and Fenner found himself the leader and spokesman of 17 Kentish ministers who were unable to subscribe to the three Articles of Conformity which demanded an acknowledgement of the Queen's supremacy and the authority of the prayer book and articles. In Feb 1584 they were all called on to answer at law and suspended from office, Dudley Fenner being arrested and imprisoned for several months. He then returned to the Netherlands and died at Middelburgh in 1587. His widow afterwards married Dr Wm Whitaker and bore him 8 children.

note 4) there is an indenture of sale dated 15 July 1568 by Thos Fenner, gent of Chichester (husband of My) to Edw Bellingham of Newtimber, of the parsonage of Hartinge.

note 5) Edw Fenner, called to the bar at the Middle Temple, was reader in the Autumn of 1576, became a serjeant 1577, a justice of the Queen's Bench on 26th May 1590, and a J.P. for Surrey. A member of the commission upon several state trials, he was present as a justice of the peace at the trial of Jn Udall in January 1590. A pamphlet was published with an account of a trial in which he tried three witches in Huntingdonshire in 1593. In 1608 he received an annuity of £50 in lieu of the time his service on circuit was discontinued. At one time he resided at Streatham, in the Surrey suburbs of London, but latterly at Hayes, Middlesex, where he was buried. He seems to have had a brother, born c1535, also named Edward, who died at Hayes a few years later (see P.C.C. wills).

### HERALDRY

Related coats of arms were borne by both the Fenners of Middlesex and their kinsfolk in Sussex (see the pedigree given under Sussex records). The one carried by those in Middlesex consisted of a green shield with a silver cross which was in turn charged with a red cross formée (i.e. with ends splayed out, rather in the manner of a Maltese cross) between four eagles with their wings expanded. Along with this shield the Sussex Fenners had a crest of a silver eagle with its legs and beak in gold.

A variation of the above escutcheon was coloured blue with a cross bearing a black cross formée between four eagles of gold with wings displayed; while another connected with the name Fenner consisted of an ermine shield (in a heraldic sense a white field with a regular pattern of small black shapes, rather like vertical arrows, designed to simulate the effect of ermine fur) with two black chevrons (i.e. inverted V-shaped bands stretching right across the shield). Reference books on heraldry also give details of a coat of arms granted to a Fenner family in Sussex about the year 1557. It comprised a silver escutcheon bearing a red engrailed (i.e. with indented edges, similar to a holly leaf) chevron between three black marine wolves or sea-dogs (a heraldic animal depicted as a hound-like dog with webbed feet and dorsal fin) with fin, belly and teeth of the first and tongue of the first. The crest was a mermaid holding a dagger in her dexter (i.e. right, though left from the point of view of the spectator) hand, all proper (i.e. natural colours). The motifs employed in this coat of arms, with their distinctly nautical flavour, suggest it must have been borne by Capt. George Fenner's branch of the Sussex Fenners (see pedigree).

## AMERICAN RECORDS

One of the first Fenners recorded in North America was Rebecca Fenner who arrived in New England in 1635 in the ship Truelove with Zachariah Whitman of Lee, Bucks - removing to Stratford, Conn. There was also a Rob Fenner at Stamford in 1641 and a Thos Fenner, an Indian trader, died at Branford, Conn., on 15 May 1647. Details on Thos' descendants are given in the Rhode Island Historical Magazine for January 1887 (reprinted the same year by J.P. Root as a separate publication) and are repeated in slightly abbreviated form here.

Thos Fenner had three sons - William who was at Providence, R.I., in 1647; a proprietor at Saybrook, Conn., by 1673 and died there before 1680 leaving no children, with his two brothers executors of his will. - Capt John, at Providence in 1645; later of Saybrook; died 1709 leaving his wife Sarah an estate of £500. His son Jn jun died unmarried while a dau Phebe was born on 6 Sept 1673. She was presumably his dau who married Gorshom Palmer or the one who married David Buell - and Capt Arthur.

Capt. Arthur was born in England in 1622 and was said to have been a Lieut in Oliver Cromwell's army, coming from a "highly respectable family". His family must have been one of those from the Sussex-Surrey district where the Christian name Arthur was not uncommon. He was at Providence by 1649, where he was a freeman in 1655 and where in 1652 he bought all the lands owned by Jn Lippitt. Arthur's home was said to have been known as "the Castle" owing to its huge chimneys. He served as a magistrate for 8 years, Governor's Assistant for 19 years, Deputy and Town Treasurer. By the commission of Governor Clark dated 19 April 1676 he was appointed "Chiefe Commander of the King's Garrison at Providence". His will was made in Sept 1703 and he died on 10 Oct 1703. He married firstly Mehitable, dau of Ric Waterman, and secondly (on 16 Dec 1684) Howlong Harris, dau of Wm & Susan Harris, who died 19 Nov 1708. By his first wife He had the following children:

Arthur, born Providence 10 Dec 1745; died 15 Oct 1805, 4th Governor of Rhode Island.

The above Gov. Arthur Fenner was appointed one of the "Committee of Inspection" on the recommendation of the Continental Congress in December 1774 and for many years served as clerk of the court of common pleas in Providence. On 5 May 1790 the Rhode Island Assembly declared Arthur Fenner Governor (anti-federalist) and as such he greeted Washington on his visit to Newport and Providence that year. He was re-elected in 1791 and remained Governor until his death at Providence in 1805.

James Fenner was the son of Gov. Arthur by his wife Amey, dau of Gideon Comstock. Born at Providence on 22 Jan 1771 he was educated at Rhode Island College (now Brown Univ) and served as member from Providence in the R.I. Assembly 1804-07; U.S. Senator from R.I. 1807; and first President of the R.I. Historical Socy 1822-33. He was elected Governor in 1811 and filled the same post 1824-31. In 1811 he declined the position of Chief Justice of the R.I. Supreme Ct. After 1845 he retired to his "What Cheer" estate and on his death on 17 April 1846 was accorded a public funeral. He married Sarah, dau of Sylvanus & Freelove Jenckes of Providence, in 1792 and was the father of Almira, Sarah, Freelove & Arthur.

Another Fenner family in America descends from Ric Fenner, a lawyer who practised at the Irish bar. He was possibly related to one of the Fenners buried at SS Peter & Kevin, Dublin (Mrs Ann 1669; a grandchild of Mr Fenner 1716; Edm 1734; and Mr Fennor's dau of Ormond Quay 1772) and to Saml Fenner who married Rebecca Adams in St My, Dublin, in 1744. The Orders of the Commissioners for Irish Affairs for 1648 contain a reference to the auditing of the accounts of Francis Fenner, a trooper, driven with others from his command under Lord Inchiquin while 18th century Irish lawyers include Ric, keeper of the Writs & clerk of the Warrants in the Common Pleas Office (Dublin Directory 1780) and Wm, Deputy Seal Keeper of Common Pleas (ibid). The first mentioned Ric emigrated to N.Carolina with his wife Anne (nee Coddington), dau of Dixie Coddington of Athlumney Castle, co. Meath, and four sons (possibly by a previous wife). Anne was a cousin of the then Governor of N.Carolina, Arthur Dobbs. The children were as follows:

Robert, a major of the Continental Line and one of the founders of the Society of the Cincinnati, lived and died at Halifax, N.C. He married My Houson and was father of Major Rob Fenner jun who served in the 1812 and Mexican Wars. Rob jun moved from N.C. to Tennessee and became the father of Rob Fenner III (killed in the massacre at Goliad, Texas) & Thos who lived in Fannin Co., Texas.

Dr Ric Fenner M.D., born in N.C., a lieutenant in the Continental Line at the age of 18; captured at the siege of Charleston; charter member Cincinnati Society; moved to Tennessee in 1823 and died there 1828; by his wife Anne (nee Geddy 1770-1852) he was the father of:

Erasmus D. - a noted physician who helped found the New Orleans Medical Journal in 1844. He married Anne America Callier and they were the parents of Chas Erasmus (b Jackson, Madison Co., Tenn. 14 Feb 1834; d 24 Oct 1911), a 1st Lieut (later Capt) in the Confederate army. In April 1862 he organised Fenner's Louisiana battery of Light Artillery at Jackson, Miss., and served with it until the surrender at Meridian in 1865. In 1865 he was a member of the Louisiana Legislature and in later life figured prominently in the legal world. He married Charlotte Payne and was father of Chas Payne Fenner (= Eveline M. Gasquet); Erasmus Darwin Fenner (= Sache Cameron McDonald) and Gladys (= Edw Jas Gazey).

Richard E. = Sarah M. Outerbridge and was father of Eugenia Ann (= Wm H. Burges), Ric Joseph, Cath Revel & Stephen Outerbridge.

In 1768 a Mr Fenner, a tailor, along with his wife, were recorded as arrivals from Connecticut on the sloop Mary; and the parish registers of Taunton, Mass., refer to the marriage of Alkanon W. Fenner & Julia Ann White in 1813 and the birth of Abby, dau of O.B. (a machinist) & My A. Fenner, in 1847. The Boston arrivals for 1822 included Jos Fenner, aged 40, mariner - a U.S. citizen so presumably American-born. Information on Fenner families in America during the 19th century may be obtained from the various trade directories published in most of the main cities. C.W.Stafford's 1797 Philadelphia Directory, for instance, listed the following Fenners:

# THE GENERAL REGISTER OFFICE

For records of English and Welsh marriages, births and deaths back as far as 1837 the principal source of information is the General Register Office at St. Catherine's House, Aldwych, London. Here are kept registers with details of all people born, married or dying in England and Wales from July 1837 up to the present day. They are listed quarterly (a birth under, say, Dec 1838 means that it was registered sometime between October 1st and December 31st, 1838) and the place name is the registration district. As examples, we give some extracts relating to some of the earlier Fenner entries. For more complete details - the exact date of birth, etc) application has to be made to the Registrar for an authorised certificate.
